There is so much more to share, and we learn more each and every week. We were unable to share everything we wanted to at the meeting. Did you know...

-A pipeline right-of-way agreement is permanent and once registered on title travels with the land to future buyers. Agreements are negotiated owner by owner. If an agreement uses broad language rather than specifically naming CO2 as the exclusive substance, future operators may assert the right to lay additional infrastructure in the same corridor **without returning for consent**.

-The Bonnyville based LICA 2025 State of the Watershed report states contamination from existing oil and gas activity is already occurring here, with Provincial regulators recording 1409 energy related release incidents in the Beaver River watershed since 2010. There is virtually **no** water quality data available for groundwater and calls to question whether adequate baseline monitoring would exist to detect any future changes.

-There are over 33,000 oil and gas wells in the Beaver River watershed alone. Without a comprehensive integrity survey of abandoned and orphaned wells within the CO2 storage footprint, we wonder if the proposed storage hub is in undisturbed geology that will keep the injected CO2 underground permanently.

If you feel you want this issue to be on your next municipal council agenda, we would be happy to come with you to the meeting and provide insight. We have recently met with both the County of St. Paul and the Town of St. Paul and will continue to follow up with them as we gather more information.

Here are a few "Did you know" facts for this month's newsletter.

- A recent media release called "Brace for Shakes" was released last week – here is link: <https://www.keepersofthewater.ca/news/fucsfudb59f6xo65aqlh20afdypcob>
This report indicates that there have been more than 30 earthquake events classified as "known induced" by the Alberta Energy Regulator. Alberta Ministry of Environment and Protected Areas told media the seismic events were reported by Shell Canada and connected to operations associated with the Scotford Upgrader and related CO2 injection activities.
- The Narwal News (June 4, 2026) is reporting that the Oilsands Alliance has reduced its targets by 77% from 68 megatonnes of emissions each year to 16. Here is the link to the story: <https://thenarwhal.ca/oilsands-pathways-emissions-promise/>
